The National Farmworkers Jobs Program (NFJP) is provided at no cost to eligible farmworkers and their dependents:

- Learn skills to stabilize or advance at your agricultural job
- · Learn skills for employment in a new industry
- · Receive individual support from Michigan Works! staff

Services



- Job and classroom training (GED, English as a second language, job-related training, tuition assistance)
- Individual Employment Planning to help you navigate career and training pathways
- Supportive services (transportation, work clothing, tools, housing, and childcare)
- Emergency assistance

Eligibility



- You or anyone in your household has worked as a farmworker in the past 24 months
- You are 18 years of age or older
- You are authorized to work in the United States
- You are a dependent of a farmworker
- Meeting income guidelines (if a member of your household receives TANF, SSI, or SNAP)



Farmwork Includes



- Raising livestock, bees, animals or poultry
- · Farming of fish
- Farming operations
- Handling, planting, drying, packing, processing, freezing or grading of agricultural/horticultural commodities
