No-cost On-Farm Training



- First Aid & CPR
- Food Safety
- OSHA
- · Pesticide Training

Training for Internal Promotions



- Financial help for on-the-job training
- Adult basic skills training including English as a Second Language
- Tuition assistance for eligible farmworkers and their dependents to acquire job-related skills
- High school diploma/high school completion/GED





Other Services

- · Individual Employment
- Planning to help participants navigate career and training pathways
- Supportive services (transportation, work clothing, tools, housing and childcare
- · Emergency assistance



Participant Qualifications

- Person (or anyone in the same household) has worked as a farmworker in the past 24 months
- · 18 years of age or older.
- · Authorized to work in the U.S.
- Meeting income guidelines (member of the household receives TANF, SSI, or SNAP)



Farmwork Definitions

- Raising livestock, bees, animals or poultry
- Fish Farming
- · Farming operations
- Handling, planting, drying, packing, processing, freezing or grading of agricultural/horticultural commodities
